Program of Study

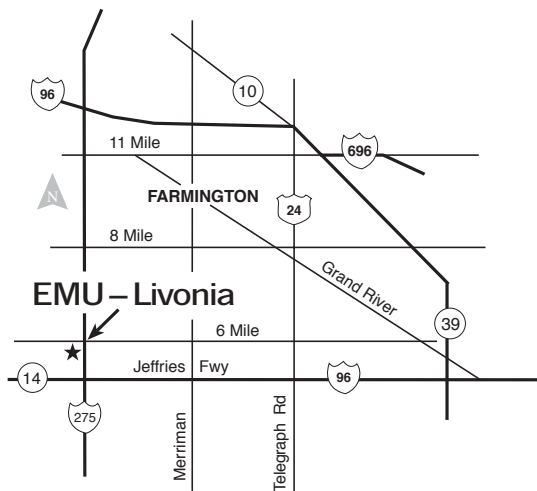
Students meet with their advisor to devise a 15-credit-hour plan to fulfill the program requirements, which includes nine credit hours of required program courses and six credit hours of program electives.

Your program advisor will meet with you to develop an individualized program of study that meets your career objectives.

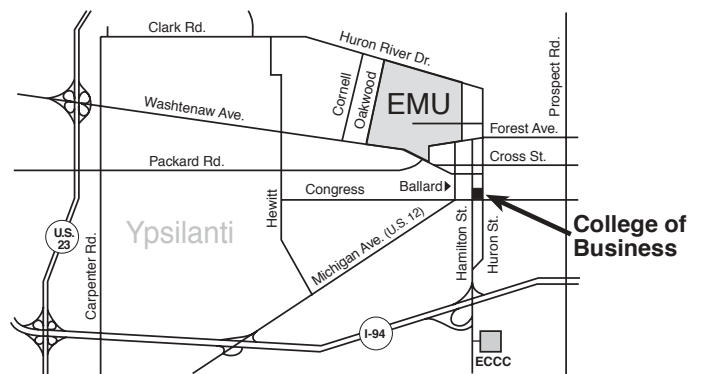
Admission
