

Urban Teacher Certification Program–Detroit

Eastern Michigan University's College of Education has initiated a post-baccalaureate program of study for non-certified teachers who hold a bachelor's degree. The goal of the course of study is to provide non-certified teachers the opportunity to complete a set of required courses and field experiences leading to teacher certification. Upon successful completion of all specified program requirements and passage of state tests, participants will become eligible for Michigan certification. The course work in this program does not lead to a master's degree.

The schedule of professional education courses in the EMU Urban Teacher Certification Program is designed to accommodate the working and travel schedules of non-certified teachers in the Detroit metropolitan area. A substantial portion of the courses will be offered in the Detroit area. All of the field work can be completed in the Detroit area schools.

POTENTIAL STUDENTS

Informational meetings will introduce potential students to the program. Students will be identified and admitted after a satisfactory review of their credentials and application to the program.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The following are minimum requirements for students to be admitted to the College of Education and to the program:

1. A bachelor's degree with a 2.50 G.P.A., from an accredited institution, or a 3.0 in a completed master's degree from an accredited institution:
 - a. completion of majors/minors
 - b. attainment of at least a 2.50 G.P.A. in the major or minor fields of study.
2. Completion of specific admission requirements, including:
 - the MTTC–State Basic Skills test
 - personal statement
 - letter of recommendation
 - official transcripts

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Student completion of the program includes:

1. Complete the same professional education courses and exhibit the same competencies as students in the regular teacher education program.
2. Complete all the other courses in general education, teachable major and minor course requirements, as well as the specified professional education sequence. For all applicants, this will require an individual meeting with the program director to identify specific requirements.
3. Satisfactory completion of requirements to qualify for admission to student teaching.
4. Satisfactory completion of student teaching.

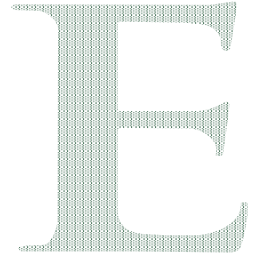

Official transcripts from all institutions you have attended must be mailed directly from the particular institution(s) to EMU-Detroit.

- **Attach a copy of your MTTC basic skills scores**
