Bachelor of Science in Applied Technology

The Bachelor of Science in Applied Technology is designed to serve those who wish to continue their education and earn a bachelor of science degree. This program is ideally suited for the individual who has received credit in a technical area from a community college. Typical candidates are employed in industry, seek to broaden their educational background, expand their knowledge and skills, and need a bachelor's degree for enhanced employment opportunities. This goal can be achieved by completing select courses in engineering technology, general education requirements, and specific classes in science and mathematics.

Transfer up to 94 Community College Credits

Of the 124 credit hours required for the Bachelor of Science in Applied Technology, up to 94 may be transferred from a community college that has an articulation agreement. 2. \$25 application fee.
3. An official transcript from each college, university, or other post-secondary education institution attended.
Note: A 2.0 cumulative GPA is required for admission.
4. Transfer applicants who have completed fewer than 12 transferable credit hours or 18 quarter hours also must submit an official high school transcript and, if under the age of 21, official ACT or SAT test results.
5. Veterans should submit a copy of their DD214 or DD295.

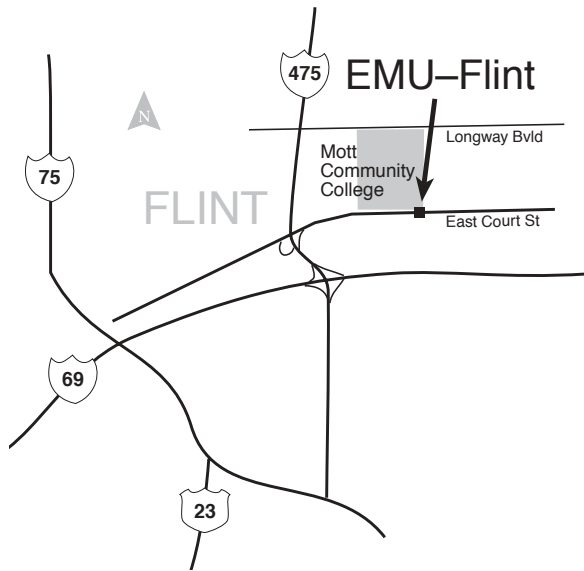

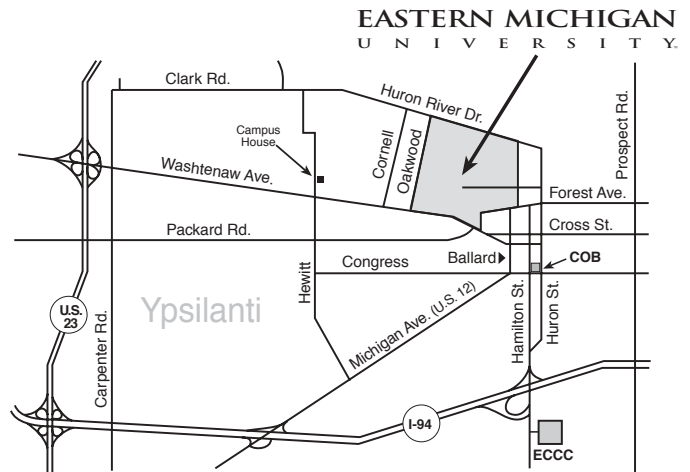
